

How will the Sports Funding be spent and who will benefit (IMPACT)?

Below is a breakdown of where our Sport Premium Grant was spent in 2019-2020 and what provision it helped to develop at our school.

To improve the quality of PE teaching and learning across the whole school.	Hire a specialist coach (West Bromwich Albion FC) to deliver quality PE lessons across the whole school (Rec to Y6). Work alongside teaching staff to provide CPD; developing their skills and knowledge of PE/Games concepts.	£5,460	Teachers develop confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport as they work alongside experienced coaches. Increase capability for delivering 'good' lessons.
To train and develop the school's football team in preparation for competitions against local schools. Staff member appointed to run an active morning club. To provide children in 'Morning' club with a healthy nutritious start to the day.	Staff member ensures the morning club is active and children begin the day actively. Provide children in 'Morning' club with fruit and milk and an opportunity to begin actively with dancing or badminton in addition to other activities.	£1,890	Children have a range of active games in the morning club. Children attending the morning club have a healthy, nutritious start to the day with fruit, juice and milk provided after their active start to the day. More children are able to access the club. Increased numbers from 20 to 40 with an appointment of an additional member of staff. Unfortunately, summer term club was cancelled due to partial closures of school and only having a limited number of key worker children.
To purchase additional resources.	Purchase resources to deliver a programme of activities to increase physical activity over the week		£250

To join Streetly Academy, a specialist PE and Sport provider.	Enable children to participate in a wide range of sporting competitions and enable staff professional development.	£1,350	Training for lunchtime supervisors enabled staff to understand the importance of active play. The PE leader accessed training for leadership development and was able to deliver training in school for the whole staff team.
Lunchtime staff lead active games during morning and lunch breaks.	Staff (lunch time supervisors and support staff) lead active and physical play on the school playground during dinner times.	£0	Children are encouraged to participate in physical play - greater numbers of children are engaged in being physically active. Social interactions and children's behaviour are improved as opportunities for team and partner games are introduced. Relationships between staff and pupils are more positive. Children's behaviour is improved at lunch times with less incidents reported in 'Behaviour' book.
To enable children to become proficient swimmers by the time they leave County Bridge Primary.	Hire of Pool at the Sneyd Association	£840	Swimming lessons take place in the Autumn and Spring terms only before Covid restrictions are introduced nationally. 87% Y6 pupils at the end of KS2 are able to swim to the NC expectation of 25m. Additional booster sessions provided in Y6 had an impact on overall outcomes. All the Y6 children had achieved their Water Safety certificate when they were in Year 4.

To hire a qualified dance teacher.	Provide additional extra-curricular clubs for two dance teams (Y1, 2 & 3 team and Y4, 5 & 6 team), cardio fitness club and a gymnastics club.	£4,506	Four additional clubs after school are available for pupils to participate. All the clubs are full to the maximum capacity (20 pupils) and further interests generated demonstrated by the waiting lists. Pupils in the dance clubs have participated in competitions within the borough but also in a neighbouring borough too. Parents have been invited to dance, gymnastics and cardio club performances throughout the year, raising the profile of dance and other clubs and giving children further opportunities for performance. Children have performed in other themed events. Overall, huge development of confidence (influencing all areas of the curriculum) and physical well-being of

			pupils. Unfortunately, due to the pandemic some events had to be cancelled in the Summer term.
To engage in Joe Wick's Daily PE	All children (and staff) were engaged in the daily PE lesson online.	£0	During Lockdowns, children at home and school were undertaking daily PE lessons via Joe Wicks. Supported and developed staff and pupils physical and mental health and wellbeing,
To develop inter-school games and the school's participation within them.	Provide pupils/teams with opportunities to take part in a range of games/matches across the different schools in the locality. Aim to promote team participation, commitment and drive.	£0	Children have greater opportunities to participate in sporting activities. Unfortunately, in the summer term, when the weather was better the schools were only open partially due to the Covid pandemic.
To develop a programme of inter-house games in the school.	Provide pupils/teams with opportunities to take part in a range of games/matches across the different Houses in the school. Aim to promote team participation, commitment and drive.	£0	Traditionally held in the summer term. This did not take place due to the Covid pandemic.
To work towards developing the provision, aiming for the Gold Awards 'School Games' mark.	Reward County Bridge for their commitment and development of competition, school sport and physical education.	£0	Not take place as schools' participation in sporting events, PE lessons and general CPD was hugely impacted by the Covid pandemic in the summer term.

Summer term 2020 was inevitably impacted by the Covid pandemic and much of the activities planned did not take place. Many of the sports competitions, including the dance performances, had to be cancelled.
