Thematic Learning

This term our thematic topic is 'What Lives In Our World?' which will allow children to learn more about animal types, their habitats and their body structure.

This topic links with Geography as the children will be learning about different animal habitats and labelling these on a map of the world. We will also be revisiting the names of the continents and identifying which areas of the world are hot and cold.

In Art and Design children will be using paint to create different animal patterns. This will allow them to contribute to a whole class collage based on the work of our class artist, Henri Rosseau.

In addition, children will be building on their Science knowledge by classifying animals into groups. They will also be identifying carnivores, herbivores and omnivores based on an animal's diet.

This topic also links with Design and Technology as children will be designing and making a bird feeder to encourage more birds to visit the school environment.




P.E

Literacy and Phonics

In Literacy we will be continuing to develop phonics skills so that children can apply them when reading and writing. Our text focus for this term is 'Zog'. This story allows for lots of opportunities to predict what will happen in the story, as well as infer character's feelings and intentions. It will also give the children opportunities to retell parts of the story using their own sentence ideas and adjectives. Children will also be learning to apply full stops, finger spaces and capital letters in all sentences.

Numeracy

In Numeracy we will begin the term by recapping how to solve multiplication and division problems using methods previously taught and applying them to word problems. We will also be developing knowledge of fractions and learning how to recognise and identify quarters of shapes, objects and amounts. This half term's learning will also include learning how to compare weight, tell the time to the hour and half past and describe the position of an object. To conclude the term we will be recapping knowledge of addition and subtraction and applying this to solve word problems and missing number problems.

Attendance and Punctuality

The continued message from last year is of course that 'Every Day Matters' - Every day that your child misses is a day of learning lost. Please support us by ensuring that your child attends school every day and is in school ready to start their learning by 8.50am.

Homework- Reminder

In Year 1, children are expected to develop some independent work skills. This includes reading (approx 10 minutes per night). We are trying to encourage a love of reading at County Bridge and would love you to share some of your favourite books, stories, poems etc. with your child. Reading books will also be sent home from school which **MUST** be brought to school every day to be used in one to one reading sessions with a member of staff.

Your child will also have a Reading Journal - We encourage you to write in this book once a week when you hear your child read. We would really love to create a dialogue between parents and school.

Maths homework will continue to be set on Purple Mash on a Friday and the deadline for completion will be Wednesday - this way children will be able to speak to their teachers on Monday or Tuesday if there is anything that they don't understand.

Spellings will also be set weekly on Purple Mash on a Friday. Children will then do their spelling test on the following Friday. Your child is expected to learn their spellings by carrying out Look, Cover, Write & Check and then use the spellings in context by writing different sentences.

Your child will also receive a Thematic Homework Challenge this week. This has been designed to encourage collaborative work between children and their parents. It can be handed in at any point during the half term and should reflect children's learning in school.
