

Nursery Newsletter : Summer 1 2022

Welcome back after the Easter break! We hope you all had lots of fun together and we look forward to hearing all about it! We also look forward to welcoming our new children and families.

Our focus this term will be on the emergence of summer and we will also begin to consider the question "Are Eggs Alive?". Children will have lots of opportunities to learn about the world around them by being outside and observing patterns and changes in nature. To start the topic, we will learn about the different types of farm animals and their names as well as learning about the life cycles of various animals such as chicks, frogs and caterpillars. Within this theme, we will also be investigating animals that lay eggs and animals that do not. The aim of this this topic is to stimulate children's curiosity, understanding, knowledge and imagination about growing and living things.

Young children need lots of physical movement, so we will aim to be outdoors learning in all types of weather. Please ensure your child has a pair of wellies in school that are clearly labelled. Please also bring in a spare set of labelled clothes in a bag to leave on your child's peg. If your child has an accident or is wet from exploring exciting water activities, we will change them but we will need the appropriate clothing to do so.

During the warmer weather, sun cream can be applied to your child before they come to Nursery. Children will have limited time in direct sunlight on very hot days. It is important that children have appropriate labelled clothing (e.g. sun hat) and water bottles on these days.

Literacy

In Nursery we will sing songs, read stories and rhymes everyday.

Each half term we will be focusing on books related to our class author (Michael Rosen) and those related to our current thinking. Books we will study this half term are 'The Odd Egg', 'Tiny Little Fly' and 'The Tiger Who Came To Tea'.

During small group time, children will focus on key skills which enable them to become great readers and great writers. Key skills include listening, paying attention, keeping concentration and taking turns to talk.

Numeracy

In our number work we will be developing our counting skills with numbers from 1-10, exploring how to sequence (the order of numbers) and matching an amount to a given number. We will also be exploring and naming 2D shapes.



Attendance and Punctuality

The continued message is of course that 'Every Day Matters' - Every day that your child misses is a day of learning lost. Please support us by ensuring that your child attends school every day and is at the school gate ready to be collected by Nursery staff by 8:40am.

Reading

In Nursery, it is important to read stories with your child every day. This enables your child to look at and interpret what is happening in the pictures and predict what might happen next. We will send home a school reading book every week. We ask for you to complete a comment in their reading log once a week to inform the Nursery team on how your child is reading at home.

Reading books will be reviewed and changed on **Thursdays** where book bags will need to remain at school, then a new book will be sent home on **Friday**. As books can be shared at any time of the week it is very important for reading books and reading logs to be brought to school **every day**. For any reading books which are damaged or not returned to school there will be a charge.

Homework

Nursery will also receive a 'Topic Homework Challenge' sheet every half term. Your child will need to complete ONE piece of homework each week. They have been designed so that parents and children can work together on homework tasks.

We hope that you enjoy them.
