Within history we will look into how the Anglo-Saxons and the Vikings impacted on our vocabulary, place names and will compare England now to how it was then.


In computing lessons, We will be developing our 'searching' skills and will use various search engines to research and locate specific information relating to our topics.

Friday 16th December - Break up for half term. Tuesday 13th and Wednesday 14th December - Year 4, 5 and 6 Christmas play.



Literacy

This half term, Year 4 will be looking at a book by Anne Fine called 'The Angel at Nitshill Road'. The children will be exploring each character in the book and how the author portrays them. We will be applying reading skills to infer and retrieve information about the events that happen throughout the book and will make judgments about the main character by using clues from the text. We will be writing character descriptions, letters and towards the end of the topic, we will be writing a different problem which could happen to the characters. Throughout this book, we will also be exploring many PSHE topics as we will be reflecting upon our own behaviour and relationships with others.

Numeracy

In class we will be securing and extending children's understanding of multiplication and division in increasingly large numbers. We will also be understanding and converting measures, classifying angles and finding the perimeter of shapes.

Times tables are huge part of Maths in Year 4, so if you could continue to support your child with their times tables up to 12, it would benefit them greatly. Children will not be able to reach agerelated expectations unless they can recall all facts for all 12 timetables. It is a requirement that your child completes the set sessions on Times Table Rockstars (TTRS) per week as part of learning in order to recall multiplication and division facts quickly, ready for their MTC (multiplication tables check) assessment at the end of the year.

Attendance and Punctuality

The continued message is of course that

'Every Day Matters' - Every day that your child misses is a day of learning lost. Please support us by ensuring that your child attends school **every day** and is in school ready to start their learning on time. This is particularly crucial after the missed learning that the Covid-19 closures may have caused.

Homework

In Year 4, children are expected to develop their independent work skills. This includes reading (approx 20-30 minutes per night) We are trying to encourage a love of reading at County Bridge and would love you to share some of your favorite books, stories, poems etc with your child. Reading books will also be sent home from school & your child will have the opportunity to borrow a free choice book from our school library.

Your child will also have a Reading Journal - We encourage you to write in this book once a week when you hear your child read. We would really love to create a dialogue between parents and school.

Individual spellings will also be set home weekly. Your child is expected to learn their spellings by carrying out Look, Cover, Write & Check and then use the spellings in context by writing interesting and varied sentences.

Your child will also receive a Thematic Homework Challenge this week. This piece has been designed to encourage collaborative work between children and their parents. It can be handed in at any point during the half term and should reflect children's learning in school.

Homework will be set and marked by Miss Stringer on Purple Mash. Homework will be set on a Friday and the deadline for completion will be Wednesday a.m - this way children will be able to speak to their teachers on Monday or Tuesday if there is anything that they don't understand.
