In Art and Design we will be learning to develop a wide range art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space.


In Geography we will be learning to use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study geography and we will be making simple maps and keys.

P.E

Literacy

In literacy this half term we will be concentrating on applying the knowledge of story elements, such as settings, dialogue, characterisation, story language and structures, to our own writing. The outcome of this is that pupils will write a retell of the traditional tale Aladdin. Children will also look at non fiction texts, identifying the structures of reports and writing one of their own.

Numeracy

In numeracy this half term we will be focusing on multiplication and division. We will be using the repeated addition method to solve multiplication calculations and the repeated subtraction method to solve division calculations. We will be finding the capacity of different containers in standard units and learning how to measure different capacities accurately. There will also be a high focus on applying mathematical skills in a range of contexts and using the correct vocabulary when discussing different methods. Finally, the 2, 5 and 10 times tables will still be a large focus as it is a year 2 requirement by Christmas, so any help from home will be gratefully appreciated.

Attendance and Punctuality

The continued message from last year is of course that 'Every Day Matters' - Every day that your child misses is a day of learning lost. Please support us by ensuring that your child attends school every day and is in school ready to start their learning by 8.50am. It is extremely important leading up to SATs that children are in school every day!

Homework

In Year 2, children are expected to develop some independent work skills. This includes reading (approx 10-15 minutes per night) We are trying to encourage a love of reading at County Bridge and would love you to share some of your favorite books, stories, poems etc with your child. Reading books will also be sent home from school & your child will have the opportunity to take a free choice book out from our school library.

Your child also has a Reading Journal - We encourage you to write in this book when you hear your child read. We would really love to create a dialogue between parents and school. Thanks.

Individual spellings will also be sent home. Your child is expected to learn their spellings by carrying out Look, Cover, Write & Check and then using the spellings in context by writing interesting and varied sentences. These spelling are essential for children to learn by Christmas!

Year 2 have also received their Topic Homework Challenges. It has been designed so that parents and children can work together on homework.

Homework is due back in school by Wednesday at 9am. This gives children an opportunity to speak to their teacher on Monday or Tuesday if there is something that they don't understand.
